


Step 3 - Explore the OCN Website Admissions Page

- Graduate Student Handbook
 - MS or PhD
- Common Undergrad Majors
 - Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Geology, Math, Microbiology, Zoology, etc.



- 1 year Calculus (ideally through differential equations and vector calculus; a proficiency exam determines placement)
- 1 year Physics
- 1 year Chemistry
- GRE (not required), TOEFL (required for international if college/university is not English speaking)

- How will you be funded? GA, TA, Fellowship?
- TAship priority for current graduate students

Letter of Recommendation Form


- 3 letters from faculty or advisors
- Student fills out top of this form
- Letter writer fills out the rest
- Letter Writer must submit the form and letter directly to Kristin at <u>kristinu@hawaii.edu</u>
 - The student applicant should not submit this themselves

Transcripts

Unofficial or Official







Step 6 - Submission

Deadline for Fall 2023 - December 15th

Step 7 - Admission

- Admission decisions released 2 3 months after the application deadline
 - February April



- Receiving a fellowship might reverse an admission decision
- Faculty receiving a grant might reverse an admission decision
